

Policy for Payment of HECS and Fees by University employees and postgraduate research students seeking to take units of study in the School of Public Health

University employees and postgraduate research students from outside the School of Public Health will be required to pay HECS contributions or fees, as applicable, for units of study in the School whether or not they wish only to audit the unit or to receive credit for it towards an award course.

University employees and postgraduate research students from within the School who want to take units of study in the School for credit towards an award course for which they are enrolled will also be required to pay HECS or fees, as applicable.

University employees and postgraduate research students from within the School who need to take units of study in the School to equip them for their job or research towards their thesis, without intention of seeking credit towards an award course, will not be required to pay HECS or fees. However, the student's or the staff member's supervisor will be required to certify their need to take the units.

Those given permission to take units without charge will be considered "audit-students", will sit-in with other students, and will be required to complete assignments and the course assessment. Places for these students will depend on availability and will need to be negotiated with each relevant course coordinator.

Fees payable under this policy will be those applicable to the class of student, local or international, seeking to take units in School courses.
